Thope you've had a wonderful Christmas celebration with your family and friends. 2023 was a good year for the Club as we ended the year with a bang with many significant events and achievements.

The Riding section did us proud with our rider, Yasmine Bonehill and Team Singapore riders clinching the team Gold with all Triple Clear rounds at the 4th AEF Showjumping CSIJ B in Seoul, Korea in June 2023. In December, Yasmine Bonehill and Elly Poh were selected to represent Singapore and Malaysia respectively at the FEI Southeast Asian Youth Cup 2023 (CSIJ-B) in Bangkok, Thailand and achieved wonderful results. Elly won the Individual Silver Medal for Malaysia and Yasmine under Team Singapore finished 4th in the Team Competition.

The Club ran two successful seasons for the Atoms Polo League which received many positive feedback. Many players shared that they were able to learn a lot from competing and watching the tournaments and can't wait for the next one this year.

We had our first Atoms International Exchange Cup on 1&2 July with the children from New Zealand.

This provided much insight to our Atoms junior players as they were able to play against their opponents and be motivated by their skills on the polo field. The Spring International Polo Tournament welcomed Siddhant Sharma, 4-goal polo player from India while the Fall International Polo Tournament season had 4-goal pros, Hissam Hyder from Pakistan and Ed Judge, International Polo Umpire for the games.

In August, the Club hosted the Sentebale ISPS Handa Polo Cup where Prince Harry, the Duke of Sussex, competed with Malcolm Borwick and Nacho Figueras to raise funds for his charity.

For our Outreach section, the Club introduced the Fruit Basket Weekend initiative in April to foster a more gracious and kind community at the Club. Members and staff were encouraged to donate fruits and drop them off at the basket in our reception to gift to our unsung heroes such as our cleaners, grooms and housekeeping staff.

The successful inaugural SPC Outreach Polo Tournament & Carnival in October received many compliments where public learnt more about the various equestrian activities we offer at the Club. The Outreach team also worked with 16 clients from TOUCH Community Services on a 6-week Equine-Assisted Programme in September and October which helped them be more confident and braver with our various equestrian activities.

Into its third year, the Academy has grown to a base of more than 400 players aged 5 and above and follows a strict curriculum which ensures that every Atom that passes the Polo Test, is comparable to the best -2 handicap players in the region. Whilst our curriculum and programmes are based on the four pillars of HPA guidelines i.e.; horsemanship, stickwork, rules & tactics and sportsmanship, we continue to introduce capsule enrichment programmes to further strengthen and equip every Atom with the necessary knowledge to make them an all-round complete polo player. The success of Atoms hinges on our structure, curriculum, programmes and the all-round quality of our Polo Professionals who carry out their duties fairly across the board to ensure that





every Atom is treated the same. Atoms lead polo professional Col. Ravi Rathore, an officer and a gentleman, oversees all the Club's polo professionals which currently includes Sani Khan and Cody Williamson. From time to time, Atoms will supplement its complement of polo pros by bringing on board international polo pros on a three-month term so that our players can experience different styles and levels of play. There is also a wealth of knowledge that can be gained from these polo pros who have played all around the world.

A good indication of how Atoms players have progressed is the teamwork amongst our players when playing with international teams who are handicap polo players of -2 and above. Our players showed excellent sportsmanship and the mettle to take on opponents who are of a higher level than them and yet giving them such a spirited display of tenacity and skill that many cannot be faulted for thinking it was a handicap polo tournament. Atoms Alumni has seen the likes of Will Peacock, Corey Koh., etc making n positive impact and contribution to our pool of handicap polo players.

As the academy ups the ante on producing only players of high quality, every Atom can expect an expanded teaching experience to raise the level of their game. A benchmark of Atoms' latest Elite players who have passed the Polo Test are; Scarlett Lowndes-Cox and Alex Haigh. As the Academy's Alumni continues to grow, there will be more international exchange programmes to create more exposure for our players and the opportunity for our Atoms to pit their skills against the best.

The Club's inaugural City Polo Event will be held sometime in November 2024 and open to the public and tourism. This event is expected to be a big draw and an Atoms tournament final will be slotted as the curtain raiser to the actual finals of the tournament. We hope to have a crowd of more than one thousand coming to enjoy this exciting spectacle of polo played at the highest levels of non-handicap polo and competitive polo. Do book your slots early.



We expect to see more Atoms passing the Polo Test which we have slotted sometime in April this year. Of key importance for every Atom that pass the polo test is the need to remember the key fundamentals of what they have learnt as an Atom and not fall into complacency of what they have learnt and just fall into routine play. They should continue to learn to stick with the key fundamentals of the game and the sportsmanship required of every polo player and respect the rules of the game.

More Atoms are also encouraged to take on quarter horse leases as this gives a player the opportunity to create a bond with their favourite horse throughout the tenure of their lease. This makes learning easier rather than having to adjust to a new horse week in and out. As a reminder, do note that our polo professionals had been given full discretion to cancel or offer alternative lessons during wet weather as they would be in a better position to decide on the safety of our players. There will be a combined prize-giving dinner event for both riding and Atoms academies where we can let our hair down and party the night away and the opportunity to recognise the best of both academies in a night filled with fun, excitement and most importantly; friendship and sportsmanship as Atoms continues to remain as one of the largest non-handicap polo academies in the world. Our success could never have been without each Atom contributing to it and the immense support from the Committee and members.

When did you start riding, and how old were you?

Diabetes Tips: How to Manage Your Blood Sugar During Chinese New Year

People with diabetes can still enjoy Chinese New Year goodies. Get easy tips from the Department of Dietetics at Singapore General Hospital (SGH) on how to keep diabetes under control during the festive period.

ven with Diabetes, you can still enjoy CNY goodies. Just take simple steps such as having a healthy meal before going on house visits, consuming smaller frequent meals and replacing sugary drinks with water.



7 Tips to keep diabetes under control during Chinese New Year

Ms Kala Adaikan, Principal Dietitian, Department of Dietetics, Singapore General Hospital (SGH), a member of the SingHealth group, provides the following tips on keeping diabetes under control during Chinese New Year:

Eat a healthy breakfast before starting your house visits

Your breakfast should include complex (starchy) carbohydrates packed with lots of fibre (e.g. whole oats, multi-grain cereals, wholemeal bread), nuts and seeds. Starchy carbohydrates will release glucose into the blood stream at a slower rate compared to sugary foods.





Set a limit to the amount of festive goodies you can eat in a day

If you're unsure what limit you should set on the love letters and pineapple tarts, check with your doctor or your dietitian. Beware how easy the total carbohydrates consumed add up with every additional peanut cookie or kueh bangkit.





Skip the sugary canned drinks

Ask for tea, water or lemon water instead, or pick one with reduced sugar. Spread out the carbohydrates throughout the day Prevent sudden spikes in blood glucose levels by eating small, frequent

meals.



Cut down on your portions

If you must have bak kwa and other new year goodies, have a bite-sized portion.



Snack on fruits, seeds and nuts

The complex (starchy) carbohydrates contained in fruits, seeds and nuts (e.g. sunflower seeds almonds, pumpkin seeds) will fill you up and make you less inclined to binge on the festive goodies.



Walk more

Exercise helps muscle cells to absorb blood glucose. So pick up your walking pace during the festive period. Walk 30 to 60 minutes every day.





SHOULD WOMEN PRACTICE INTERMITTENT FASTING?

Skipping or dramatically delaying meals is counterproductive for most women. That's the general conclusion of a super-deep dive we did on the topic of women and intermittent fasting (IF).

Molecular biologist Dr. Helen Kollias explains that while IF can work well for many men, most women won't benefit. (To be sure, there are always exceptions.)

That's because women might be more sensitive to calorie restriction. Intermittent fasting involves shorter feeding windows (and longer periods of fasting), which means people usually eat less.

- Fasting in women may upset female hormone balance, menstrual periods, ovulation, menopause symptoms, and metabolism.
- Nutrient deficiencies, overexercising, mental / emotional stress, illness, or too little rest and recovery–can compound the negative effects of IF.
- Changes in reproductive hormones can also affect mood and thinking, digestion, recovery, protein turnover, bone formation, fat storage, and appetite.
- Intermittent fasting isn't advised in children, teens, pregnant women, or anyone with a history of disordered eating. It's also probably not a good idea for women who are trying to get pregnant, or who are breastfeeding or experiencing menopause.
- There MAY be some support for fasting in women who have polycystic ovary syndrome (PCOS).
- Women curious to try intermittent fasting might start with gentler approaches: reducing snacking between meals, and slightly extending the time between eating.
